- Women's Grievance Redress cell- Vishakha is actively engaged in arranging various activities
- NSS Cell is actively working as social responsibility
- The management is providing all necessary infrastructure facilities.
- INFIBNET facility an N-List registration to all faculty and students

Weakness

- The students enrolled in the college are from family of farmers, less awareness among the student regarding job oriented education
- 90% Students are from socially, economically backward classes hence courses that require fee/are on non -grant basis cannot be undertaken by the institution
- Poor knowledge base, lack of proper communication skill of the student and faculty pose a great challenge to transact the present curriculum
- Unavailability of postgraduate program
- Science faculty is on non-grant basis
- Due to non-Grant status of science faculty institute cannot provide quality staff and laboratories
- Consistent electric power supply during working hours, low connectivity of internet is measure hurdle for the use of ICT and online resources.
- The placement cell with the help of alumni association could play active role in employability enhancement and placement of students
